CHT Carnarvon has worked hard over the years to establish close ties with the Waipareira Trust and this is now bearing results. Staff from the Trust drive our kaumatua (elders) to Henderson every Tuesday. There they have the opportunity to have supervised swimming, followed by morning tea, then arts and crafts, followed by lunch. After a period of socialising they can learn or watch traditional music makers perform before returning to Carnarvon.

CHT have engaged a new company to maintain the gardens and they are proving most successful. Residents now report increased enjoyment when taking a walk.

We have now recruited a third Activities Coordinator, Paul and so we have activities seven days a week. Paul is an accomplished musician himself and includes this as part of his activities.
