Despite Hamilton's typical weather refusing to cooperate, our small men's group outing to the local airport for morning team and plane spotting turned out to be a delightful experience.

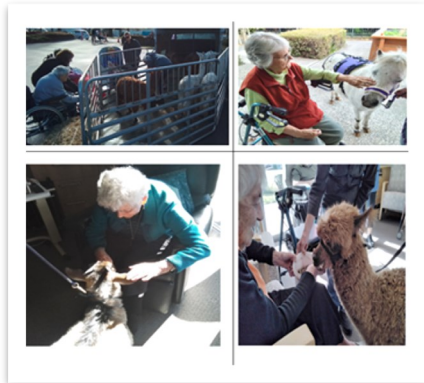

At Te Awamutu, we are dedicated to enhancing the well-being and engagement of our residents through a variety of stimulating outdoor events.

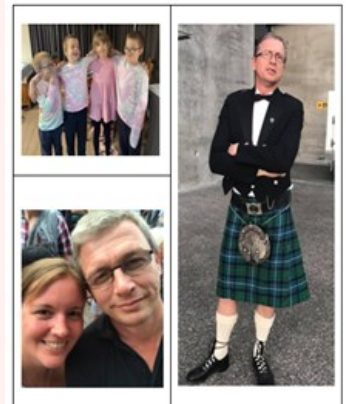
Our initiatives include farm and animal themed activities, where residents can interact with friendly animals and enjoy the tranquillity of nature.
